

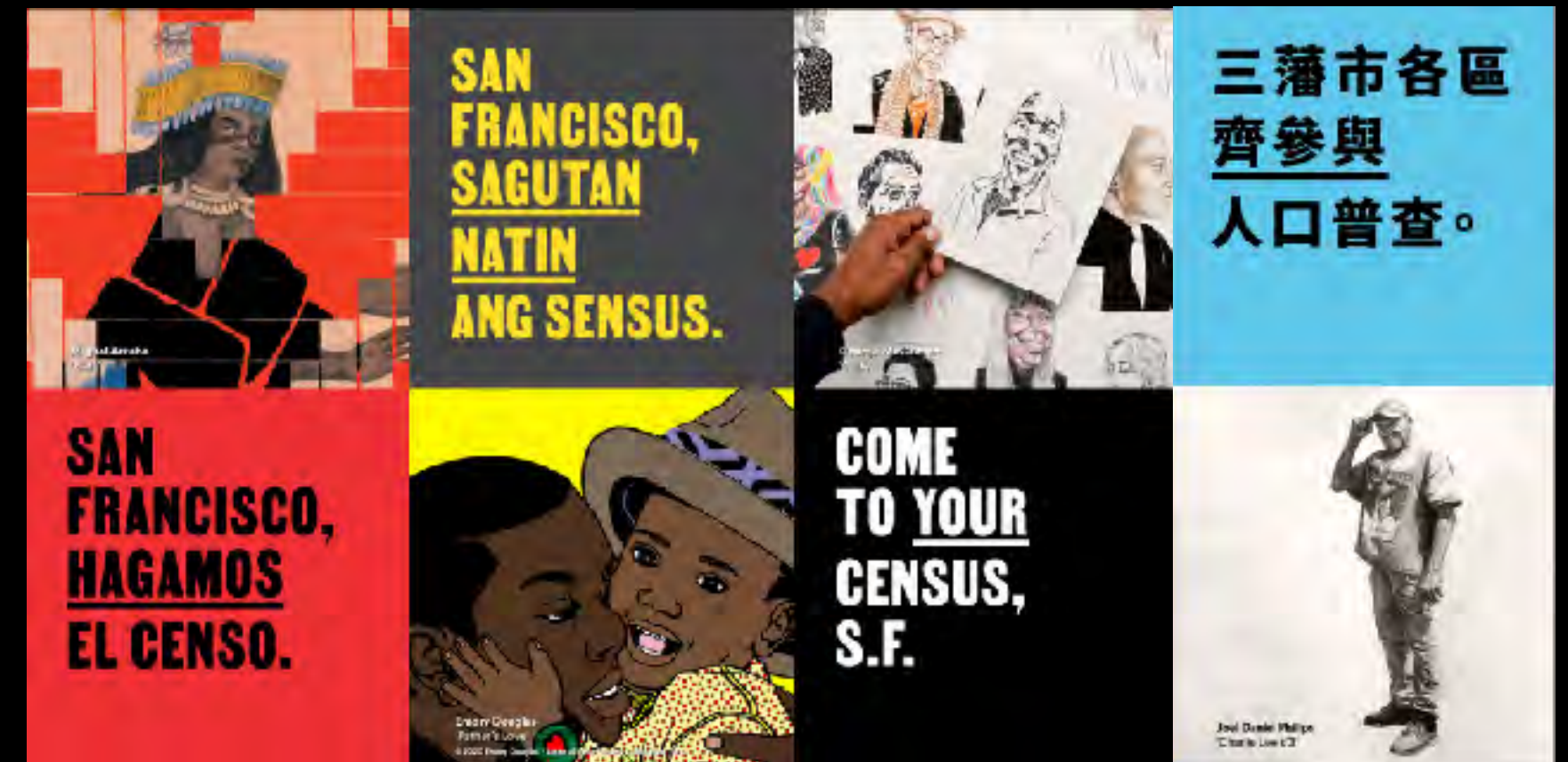
Art+Action
